

1772 FOUNDATION AWARDED PROJECTS 2017



For the seventh consecutive year, 1772 Foundation partnered with the New Jersey Historic Trust to offer Capital Preservation Grants up to \$15,000 to nonprofit organizations for exterior repair and restoration projects. The grants require a one-to-one match from the grant recipient, and are limited to certified 501(c) 3 organizations, excluding schools and religious congregations.

Since 2011, the Historic Trust has recommended grant awards totaling over \$2 million for 162 projects, in partnership with the 1772 Foundation.

In 2017, the Historic Trust evaluated 57 applications requesting \$665,451.40 and recommended funding totaling \$292,155 to 23 applicants.



MERCER COUNTY



Adams and Sickles Pharmacy, Trenton

A \$15,000 grant to Oaks Integrated Care will help fund repairs to the masonry, wood, and replacement of custom shingles on this once commercial pharmacy building now used for low-income housing.



Holmes-Hendrickson House, Holmdel Township

A \$15,000 grant to the Monmouth County Historical Association will help fund the replacement of the cedar roof on this 18th century Dutch vernacular building.



Willow Hall, Morristown

A \$15,000 grant to The Passaic River Coalition will help fund window and door restoration, and exterior painting to its historically accurate cottage style.

Foster-Armstrong House, Montague

A \$8,000 grant to the Montague Association for the **Restoration Community** History will help fund surface restoration of the North wall and reglazing windows.

Monmouth County



Strauss Mansion, Atlantic Highlands

A \$10,000 grant to the Atlantic Highlands Historical Society will help fund porch repair and restoration to this 1893 summer cottage.



Landing Railroad Station, Roxbury

A \$13,310 grant to the Fanwood-Scotch Plains Rotary Frazee House, Inc. will help fund the reconstruction of chimneys and repairs to the chimney masonry.



Neptune High School, Ocean Grove

A \$7,725 grant to the Ocean Grove Historic Preservation Society, Inc. will help fund new security cameras and upgrades to the security system.



Ralston Cider Mill, Mendham Township

A \$15,000 grant to The Ralston Cider Mill will help fund the stabilization and restoration of the garage foundation



Mt. Kemble Home, Morristown

A \$15,000 grant to Homeless Solutions, Inc. will help fund the repair, painting, and reinstallation of the shutters and hardware to complete exterior restoration to the 1878 Victorian designed house.



Oswald J. Nitschke House, Kenilworth

A \$5,313 grant to the Kenilworth Historical Society, Inc. will help fund the restoration of 25 original wooden storm windows on this NJ and Nationally Registered house.
